

# 2018 JAPAN ACADEMIC CHALLENGE

Date:	<p>Saturday, <b>March 3, 2018</b></p> <p>Registration begins at 11:30am.</p> <p>*Participants may bring in light snacks, but please have lunch before the contest starts (refreshments will NOT be served this year)</p>
Place:	Mercer University Atlanta Campus, Cecil B. Day Hall
<p>Levels:</p> <p>Level 1:</p> <p>Level 2:</p> <p>Level 3:</p> <p>Level 4:</p>	<p>Contestants will be divided into four levels.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students enrolled in first year high school-level Japanese language study</li> <li>• Students enrolled in second year high school-level Japanese language study</li> <li>• Students enrolled in third year high school-level Japanese language study</li> <li>• Students enrolled in fourth year high school-level Japanese language study</li> </ul>
Number of students in each level.	<p>2-3 students per team</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The students of virtual schools may pair up with the students from other virtual schools</li> <li>• Each school may submit two teams for each level.</li> </ul>
Topic:	Japanese history, geography, language, current events, and other cultural aspects
Eligibility:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Each school may submit up to two teams for each level.</li> <li>• Contestants must be current high school students.</li> <li>• Contestants have not lived in Japan for more than 3 months.</li> <li>• Contestants come from homes where Japanese is not spoken regularly.</li> </ul>
Format of the competition:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The three Judges will judge throughout the competition.</li> <li>• An emcee will read the questions throughout the competition</li> <li>• Only the Final Round is open to audiences.</li> </ul> <p>We recognize that you, the teachers, are the foremost experts in teaching and testing Japanese language, culture, history, and current events. <b><u>Thus, to ensure that the event retains the highest level of quality, the eligibility will require that each team's registration be accompanied by a minimum of 3 suggested questions (and answers).</u></b> For example, if a teacher plans to register teams for Level 1 and 3, that teacher must provide 3 Level 1 questions and 3 Level 3 questions. We would also welcome questions from each of your participating students as well. <b><u>All questions should be submitted with the online registration.</u></b></p>

	<p><u>Preliminary Round</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Each level will have one preliminary round.</li> <li>• Preliminary Round will have 15 Questions and 2 Bonus Questions.</li> <li>• 15 Questions value at 10 points, and Bonus Questions value at 5 points each.</li> <li>• Questions are read only once.</li> <li>• During the preliminary round, each team has 30 seconds to write an answer on a provided answer sheet. Conferring is allowed between team members. Any member of the team may write the answer(s) to the question.</li> <li>• The 3 teams with the highest scores in the preliminary round go on to the Final Round.</li> </ul> <p><u>Final Round</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• During the Final Round, there will be 10 Toss-up questions valued at 10 points each, and 2 Bonus Questions valued at 5 points each.</li> <li>• Teams will have 30 seconds to “ring-in” to signal their answer. The answer must be given immediately without delay, so ring in only when you are prepared to answer. The team member who “rings-in” must answer the question.</li> <li>• <b>NO CONFERRING IS ALLOWED IN THE FINAL ROUND.</b></li> <li>• During the Final Round, teams responding before a question has been read completely will not have the benefit of having the question re-read.</li> <li>• In the event that there is a tie "ring-in" on a question, all teams signaling will be asked to write their answer on the paper provided.</li> <li>• After a team “rings-in,” the team members who rang-in must wait to be recognized by the Moderator’s Aid.</li> <li>• In case of a tie-breaker, all teams should remain in the area. Students who leave the competition area may be disqualified.</li> </ul>
Causes for Disqualification:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students leaving the competition site</li> <li>• Use of offensive language</li> <li>• Challenging or showing a lack of respect to the moderators, judges, or staff</li> </ul>
Prizes:	Prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third place
